BACKGROUND

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The IN PATH - Intelligent Pathways for Better Inclusion project is a 2 year European initiative (Oct. 2011 - Sep. 2013) co-funded by the Lifelong Learning Programme and is shaped within the European policy priorities.

“Social inclusion through education and training should ensure equal opportunities for access to quality education, as well as equity in treatment, including by adapting provision to individuals’ needs.” (2010/C 135/02)

OBJECTIVES

The IN PATH project aims to break the pattern of transferring poverty and exclusion from one generation to the next, by empowering marginalized and disadvantaged citizens to easily manage everyday problems in different areas, and not to be held back by their background.

This will be done through the use of key points of Howard Gardner's Multiple Intelligences Theory (MIT) (1983, 1999).
