



What is TOI TOI TOI?

The name TOI TOI TOI is intended as an homage to the former Leonardo da Vinci Transfer of Innovation projects (LdV-TOI), which are in the focus of the project's activities.

The project aims to develop online evaluation tools through a meta-evaluation of already completed projects for a pro-active rise of the impact of EU-projects.

These evaluation-tools will help project-coordinators in preparing impact oriented project-consortia. The development of the TOI TOI TOI evaluation-tools is based on two comprehensive scientific analysis-steps: The first step is to analyse all Leonardo da Vinci transfer-projects completed from 2006-2013 with network and cluster evaluation. The second step is the construction and development of qualitative interviews with coordinators and stakeholders, based on the results of the evaluation. With the combination of these two steps, concrete impact-rising criteria on both partner and consortial level will be deduced. These aspects will be used for developing the evaluation-tools which will be elaborately tested and then will be available online to download for free.

What we have done

TOI TOI TOI successfully started on the 1st of October 2014 and the kick-off meeting took place on the 6th and 7th of November in Krems / Austria. During the first months, the project team started to work on organizational and scientific tasks.

We could finish following tasks:

- Project handbook
- Dissemination products
- Pre-Analysis (meta-data of Leonardo da Vinci projects)
- Planning of further analysis steps

Our next steps

In the next months we will start clustering all Leonardo da Vinci projects from 2007-2103 by using methods from network-analysis. Geographical aspects will be used to classify consortia into “cooperation clusters”.

We expect several cluster-cases and based on these cases a “European Cooperation Map” which will show the development of European cooperation projects from 2006-2013 will be developed. This map will present the cooperation between the program-countries of Leonardo da Vinci.
